

Implementation process

- Individual level (learning processes, research, knowledge acquisition,
 - attitude development ...)
- Team level (training of the team, exchange among each other, transfer to work ...)
- Institutional level (dynamics at team/institutional level ...)
- Network level (symposia, professional articles, networking, development of support structures ...)
- Professional practice (quality criteria, final symposium ...)

Forms of digital violence

- sexist comments / messages
- Cybergrooming Targeted contact with minors with sexual sexual intentions via digital media
- Image-based violence
- Share violence threatening/disseminating intimate chats/recordings (without consent)
- Identity abuse
- Possession/production/dissemination of abusive images
- Livestream abuse











Forms of digital violence



An athletics coach requests masturbation pictures from a minor on the team... Videos of a young person dancing and playing sports are commented on by school peers in a sexual manner.

Adolescents and adults consume videos that depict minors in sexually explicit poses.

Online

Offline

The partner of a woman with three children initiates sexual assaults via chats and through gift giving (e.g. Tablet, Drone).

A perpetrator repeatedly threatens via chat to publish videos online of a rape. Naked pictures (de facto photo montages) of a young person circulate on WhatsApp. As a result, the girl is berated.











Prevention work

- Prevention or minimisation of violence
- Education without fuelling fears
- regular services (not a one-off)
- Comprehensive services in the appropriate setting
- Making support/help structures known to the public
- Low-threshold messages using visual material

Quote from the reflection sheets

"How can the topic of digital media be integrated [into prevention] in an age-appropriate way? Without prescribing rules of behaviour. And in doing so, take into account the needs and developmental tasks of the children/adolescents?"











The youth of today ...

- ... do they have to be on their mobile phones all the time?
- ... do they have to carry the mobile around so obviously?
- ... do they have to post pictures of themselves all the time?
- ... do they have to send those naked photos?
- ... do they have to take part in challenges?
- ... must there always be new platforms?











The youth of today ...

- → Yes, because the issues have always existed just acted out in a different way
- they represent/present/trie out
- A lot of what young people do is not understood
- There is a lot of talk about young people, but less with them
- They grow up in a sexualised and digitalised society.
- The focus is often too much on the discourse of danger instead of the fun factor of digital media.











Adolescence

- Questioning / reviewing instilled values
- testing out and associated with this crossing boundaries
- Risky behaviour
- Search for own values / norms
- Sexual education
- Detachment from guardians dissociation
- Establishing and maintaining relationships / contacts











The appeal of digital media

- direct / always available contact
- every area of life (co)determined
- timeless, location-independent, unobserved
- high information gain
- enables participation
- high pleasure / fun factor











The appeal of digital media

- Boundary perception / demarcation can be difficult
- → Suggestions for discussion:
 - How can I tell that I really want something / don't want something)?
 - Why is it so difficult not to answer immediately?
 - Why is it so difficult not to post pictures?
- Agreement / trust is not a stable negotiation

Prevention work Case vignette Eli

"And then we collected the mobile phone."

- Demonstrates helplessness
- Expression of insecurity
- Feelings of powerlessness
- Shows media-sceptical attitude
- Reaction based on own experience
- Emotional reaction no factual level
- Places joint responsibility on those affected
- Trust ≠ Abuse of trust











Preventive attitude

- Consideration of the changing lifeworlds of young people
- No distinction between analogue/digital or online/offline
- Digital media are an important part of young people's everyday lives.
- Recognition of the predominantly positive significance of digital media
- Mediatised sexual violence can never be completely prevented
- Considering possible previous experiences of violence
- Raise awareness without prejudice
- No victim blaming











Preventive attitude

- Responsibility for violence lies with the perpetrators
- No trivialisation / dramatisation of violence.
- Convey that something can be done (even if no secure deletion from the internet is possible)
- mediatised sexual violence is mostly relationship violence (social proximity is increased)
- Offer reliable bonding/help structures
- Role model function of adults
- Critical attitude towards commercial behaviour of providers

Cybergrooming

- Violation of the right to sexual self-determination
- Criminal offence according to §176 par. 4 no. 3 StGB
- Preparation, initiation of acts of abuse by means of digital media
- Targeted, strategic, skilful manipulation of children / adolescents to engage in sexual acts
- usually with the intention of producing / disseminating child sexual abuse material (so-called child pornography)











Cybergrooming Strategies

- Identification of potential victims
- Building trust, gaining trust
- Creation of intimacy
- valorisation
- Familiarisation with sexually tinged communication / atmosphere
- Desensitisation / creation of bias
- Enmeshment in dependency
- Bribery / Blackmail / Pressure

18:07 **A_Rendelle:** Can we talk right now? I'm in trouble with my mother right now.

18:14 **A_Rendelle:** What's the matter? Are you angry because of the picture or why?

18:32 **A_Rendelle:** Why?

22:45 **A_Rendelle:** What can I do to make you trust me??? I'll send you a topless picture. Wait.

18:06 **Dior:** I told you: a lot to do.

18:32 **Dior:** Just forget it. You don't trust me. Maybe we'd better leave it.

22:45 **Dior:** First you pretend to be an experienced power woman and then you fumble. I let myself be fooled. I thought you were real.

22:45 **Dior:** Rhubarb. You'll have to come with something better if you want to make up for it.

Tip: Sounds a bit like Virginia;-)





Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

What happens in the chat process?

- Power asymmetry due to maturity / status / life experience ...
- Interconnectedness of perpetrator strategies and media use
- Increasing sexualisation
- Shift in responsibility











Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

How does Dior act?

- powerful
- often means the opposite of what he writes
- at first valorisation
- feigns disinterest / makes her wait
- plays with A_Rendelle's feelings
- disregards resistance -> latent coercion
- reinforces ambivalences
- promotes pressure of expectations











Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

How does A_Rendelle behave?

- ambivalent
- tries to prevent / cope with impending loss of contact
- Conflict of needs (intimacy/esteem ≠ fear)
- Voluntariness is more and more restricted
- Objectification of their femininity
- Exit strategies (leave chat, don't send a photo, confide in someone)
 do not seem to be an option











Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

Which digital aspects play a role?

- Importance of consensuality
- Boundaries are often more blurred in the digital space
- Supposed anonymity of the digital space
- Trust ≠ Abuse of trust











Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

What does the chat process trigger in you?











Case vignette A_Rendelle and Dior

- Behaviour of affected persons accompanied by mixed feelings /ambivalences
- Desire for attention / familiarity / intimacy
- Fear of loss / fear of isolation / insecurity
- Abuse of trust
- Power asymmetry











Prevention work

Is the sentence useful in this case:

"You do have to think carefully about who you send what to?"











Prevention work

- digital communication creates a pull effect
- in digital communication less attentiveness for feelings / body signals / boundary violations
- Prevention work does not have to be reinvented but must be supplemented by digital aspects











Prevention - Contents

take action beyond against cyber digital sexual violence

- Signal openness and resilience
- Offer to talk
- Strengthening self-determination / empowerment
- Addressing feelings
- Encouraging intuition
- Importance of consensus / privacy
- Imparting knowledge (forms / consequences / rights)
- Media competence
- Perpetrator-victim dynamics
- Making help structures known

"In this respect, a pedagogy oriented towards prohibitions and control cannot offer orientation, because that would be like describing a path to someone by only explaining to them where they are not allowed to go."
